Reflections Upon Living Here...

"We wake, if we wake at all, to mystery, rumors of death, beauty, violence....' Seem like we're just set down here,' a woman said to me recently, 'and don't nobody know why.'

...Some unwonted, taught pride diverts us from our original intent, which is to explore the neighborhood, view the landscape, to discover where it is that we have been so startlingly set down, even if we can't learn why." —Annie Dillard, Pilgrim at Tinker Creek

People who have come to know me know that I love quotes, and this quote may define my life among you at this time. Please allow me to make some observations about our life together.

First, I have enjoyed being here...the people, and landscape with its own beauty, the wider area. There are real characters in this place, more mysterious than the land. There is real stubbornness here to exist over 100 years in such a windswept plain also. That trait is fine unless it divides us from each other and from God. There is much beauty here, including Aberdeen, Blue Cloud Abbey, the fields, the lakes, the Granary. I have enjoyed landscaping the parsonage with your plants and memorial trees.

Second, this Parish is healthy. There are few financial problems. But that doesn't mean that all is always well. We can often buy our way out of discipleship. There needs to be more "hands on" mission work both here and elsewhere. There is a wonderful world beyond the town borders. Check it out—camps, missions, wider church gatherings. These churches are but a small part of a larger and more exciting wider church and world. Sometimes, we forget that.

Any problems we have can be solved with God's help from within us. "The Kingdom of God is within you." Let us not be so quick to blame either the minister or each other. Let us be more ready to applaud and cheer each other on. Bill Janklow's mother at age 88 said "If you don't come to see me when I'm alive, don't bother showing up when I'm dead." Say good things to the living while they're here—don't wait until the funeral! I've tried to model both thanksgiving and encouragement, but it has been

difficult to do at times. Gossip can kill the spirit and kill leaders in our midst. Read the book of James in the Bible for guidance about the tongue.

Let us all be more open and welcoming. There is a Biblical mandate to "welcome the stranger" in our midst. Often, that stranger is a new minister or teacher in the community. Every new person brings gifts to unwrap with love - invite them to do so. Every new person is a reason to be interrupted from our routines. Be interruptable. The Kingdom will then grow in our midst when people learn that our churches are very welcoming communities. Such is not always the case. But we are the only people who can change that with God's help. I will probably have pleased 100% of the people here–50% when I came, and 50% when I leave (quoted to me by a member of the wider Parish when I came.)

Ultimately, we are in no position to evaluate what our presence means among others because we are all sowing seeds, hopefully seeds of kindness. So I close with another quote, this time by Albert Schweitzer (another minister and musician):

"No ray of sunshine is ever lost. But the green which it awakens into existence needs time to sprout, and it is not always granted for the sower to see the harvest. All work that is worth anything is done in faith."

Richard was a member of the Minnesota Conference 1969-79 before coming to the SD Conference (previous to the Dakotas Conference before the merger). This move will also put him about 80 miles from where he grew up west of Duluth.

Richard's last Sunday here will be June 23.



Marjorie Wright gave devotions using the subject of Pentecost.


Betty Taylor volunteered to chair the lunch served during the Alumni Reunion on June 29.
