The following items were on the agenda Dec. 10th:

- The Mission Statement was read in unison by the 11 members present.
- UMW Pres. Linda Thurston shared a synopsis of the year's accomplishments. Installation of 2004 officers will be held at the meeting on January 21st at 2:00 pm.
- Lay Leader Carna Atherton-Pray noted that service time changes to 11:00 am starting January 4th. She also stated there will be a change in the order of worship at future church services.
- The choir is having practices, and arrangements have been made to present special music December 21st by soloist Amanda Swenson, and a quartet. There will be special music Christmas Eve as well.
- Chairman of the Trustees, Tyke Nyberg, announced that there is a need to replace the church front doors. Cost of steel doors will be approximately \$1,200. Installation will not be made until Spring, and some further sealing of the present doors will be attempted in the interim.
- The Mission Committee reported that the freewill offering of \$500 at the Community Thanksgiving Dinner is being divided equally between The

Banquet and the local Crisis Fund.

- Rev. Piehl announced that the District Superintendent will be in Groton for a combined parish meeting on January 20th at 7:00 pm. The Administrative Councils of both churches and the Pastor/Parish Relations Committee will be involved. The general purpose of the meeting is to evaluate and discuss future goals.
- He also reported that co-chairmen for the UMYF starting in January will be Lars and Kelli Hanson and John and Meri Erickson.
- The net profit from the Men's Dinner is \$1,962.22. Use of the funds is not yet designated.
- Chairman Bill Brotherton thanked the committee members for their work and assistance during the past three years.
- The next Administrative Council meeting will be January 13th, 2004 at 7:30 pm with Mary Hayenga presiding as Chairman.
