Pastor's Lesson

We can't verify the accuracy of this report, but it has been alleged that there was an article in NA-TIONAL GEOGRAPHIC several years ago that provided a penetrating picture of God's awesome presence.

After a forest fire in Yellowstone National Park, forest rangers began their trek up a mountain to assess the inferno's damage.

One ranger found a bird literally petrified in ashes, perched statuesquely on the ground at the base of a tree. Somewhat sickened by the sight, he knocked over the bird with a stick. When he struck it, several chicks scurried from under their dead mother's wings.

The loving mother hen keenly aware of impending disaster had carried her offspring to the base of the tree and had gathered them under her wings. Instinctively knowing that the toxic smoke would rise. She could have flown to safety but had refused to abandon her babies. When the blaze had arrived and the heat had singed her small body the mother had remained steadfast. Because she had been willing to die, those chicks under the cover of her wings had lived. (HOMILETICS/February 2004, p56)

"He shall cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you shall trust" (Psalm 91:4).

I have heard of similar instances with plain old free ranging

farm hens with their brood, but never been able to verify it. It does give new meaning to a hen gathering her chicks.


Most of the time, we think of a hen as just a chicken – not willing to fight, unable to do much but become dinner for humans or wild predator. Not a hen with chicks. If you ever experienced one, you remember it. They are not large or fierce but they are protective. They will fight with everything they have, even their life to protect those defenseless fluff balls called chicks.

We have a tendency to think of Jesus as weak, not much of a fighter, but at one point we hear him say, "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those sent to it. How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!" (Luke 13:34).

Only the chicks willing to come to their mother's call, only those willing to trust themselves to their mother's protection lived.

A thought in this season of Lent.





UMW Focus Days is April 1st at Conde Methodist Church (\$4.00). Groton UMW is responsible for a skit on Africa.


Betty Hawthorne, Watertown, is our new UMW Shepherdess.





You always hear the usual stories of pennies on the sidewalk being good luck, gifts from angels, etc. This is the first time I've ever heard this twist on the story. Gives you something to think about

Several years ago, a friend of mine and her husband were invited to spend the weekend at the husband's employer's home. My friend, Arlene, was nervous about the weekend. The boss was very wealthy, with a fine home on the waterway, and cars costing more than her house.

The first day and evening went well, and Arlene was delighted to have this rare glimpse into how the very wealthy live. The husband's employer was quite generous as a host, and took them to the finest restaurants. Arlene knew she would never have the opportunity to indulge in this kind of extravagance again, so was enjoying herself immensely.

As the three of them were about to enter an exclusive restaurant that evening, the boss was walking slightly ahead of Arlene and her husband. He stopped suddenly, looking down on the pavement for a long, silent moment. Arlene wondered if she was supposed to pass him. There was nothing on the ground except a single darkened penny that someone had dropped and a few cigarette butts. Still silent, the man reached down and picked up the penny. He held it up and smiled, then put it in his pocket as if he had found a great treasure. How absurd! What need did this man have for a single penny? Why would he even take the time to stop and pick it up?

Throughout dinner, the entire scene nagged at her. Finally, she could stand it no longer. She casually mentioned that her daughter once had a coin collection, and asked if the penny he had found had been of some value.

A smile crept across the man's face as he reached into his pocket for the penny and held it out for her to see. She had seen many pennies before! What was the point of this? "Look at it." He said. "Read what it says." She read the words "United States of America." "No, not that; read further." "One cent?" "No, keep reading." "In God we Trust?" "Yes!" "And?" When I was out shopping today, I found a penny on the sidewalk. I stopped and picked it up, and realized that I had been worrying and fretting in my mind about things I cannot change. I read the words, "In God We Trust," and had to laugh. Yes, God, I get the message. It seems that I have been finding an inordinate number of pennies in the last few months, but then, pennies are plentiful!
