Swedish Pineapple Cake

2 Cups White Sugar

1-20 oz can crushed pineapple with juice

1 tsp soda

1 tsp vanilla

2 eggs (optional)

2 cups flour

1/2 cup chopped pecans

Mix by hand and pour into 9X13 ungreased pan. Bake in 350 degree oven for 30-35 minutes - test for doneness.

Icing

3/4 cup granulated sugar 1 stick oleo

1-8 oz pkg cream cheese Cream sugar, oleo, and cream cheese - add 1/2 cup chopped pecans. Spread on cake as soon as it comes out of the oven. Cool. Cover and refrigerate.

A professor once asked a young man studying for the ministry what the cross of Christ meant to him. The student said, "Well, the cruel death of God's Son, Jesus, was the most soul-shocking event imaginable. 

The next committee will be March 9, at 7:30 pm






