


Conde Ad Council Meets Wednesday, September 27th at 7:30 PM

Surely, each of us can recall Sunday school teachers who have had a profound influence on our lives. One man remembers a businessman who taught high school boys each Sunday.




"That advice has served me well," said the man. "I have always remembered it."

When he heard that last phrase, one 5-year-old boy looked up at me with a puzzled look on his face and asked, "On Tuesday?"


"No," I laughed, "Not Tuesday, to stay."
