Hostesses were Lois Trapp and Betty Taylor.








Newsletter Items from Nov. 14, Admin Council Meeting

Finance: The 2008 budget was presented and approved by the Administrative Council. Overall the budget is less than 2007 mostly due to apportionments being less as a result of the work done to clean up our membership roles.

Witness: Clare Brotherton reported on the work she has been doing to clean up our membership roles.

Youth Fellowship: The youth group plans to meet twice a month. There were six or seven at the first meeting,

which included a meal.

Janitorial Services: The board approved the hiring of Kelly Hanson to provide janitorial services for our church.

Advent Studies: Pastor Jan presented two options for adult Advent studies. We will see how much interest there is and what the best time for these study groups would be before deciding on the study material.


