Fall has arrived according to the calendar, but the signs of Fall have been seen for weeks. My challenge is trying to read them. Before I go further, I should mention I have never been good at reading signs.

One of the signs of Fall has been the preparations for the Fall Bazaar put on by the church in Groton, especially by the women's group. I missed this sign when I walked into the church kitchen and saw a group of people boiling potatoes and then squashing them through a "strainer-type" tool. When I asked what they were doing, they looked at me as if I had arrived from Saturn! Being Dutch, how was I supposed to know how lefse was made?

Another sign of the season came in the form of signs. I received a large package of political signs from my favorite presidential campaign. When I gave one of the signs to a good friend, she announced, "Now I have something to burn to keep me warm." After we laughed with the group of friends standing around us, another friend said, "Rob, didn't you know you are in a definite minority around here?" With the exception of 1972, the State of South Dakota (my home state) has

voted the same way in every presidential election since 1964. How was I supposed to know that sign?

The sign I should have read immediately was the one I finally

saw a couple of days later. I arrived in church on Sunday to see (or not see) many of my farm families missing. Each of these families had been in church services almost every Sunday, even in the Summer. Why were they missing on this particular Sunday? It bothered me for days, even though I heard the rain fall heavily on Sunday night. Why would faithful, wonderful Christians miss out on the fellowship and worship on a Sunday morning?

When I finally asked another church member, I was asked, "Didn't you hear the rain on Sunday?" The question was accompanied by one of those looks as if I just arrived from Saturn.

I finally "caught the sign" two days later when I was visiting someone and saw what looked like a thousand combines in the bean fields. It's harvest!

Now, don't get me wrong. I am not writing about "taking the Sabbath day in vain." I know there would be people saying, "We never worked on Sunday when I was young." If you never worked on a Sunday when you were young, God bless you. And if you worked last Sunday before the rain fell, God bless you too. Why the blessings? You were reading the signs and took the opportunity given to you to support your family and fulfill your responsibility.

Those folks who read the signs are a good example to all of us. Watch for the people around you. Be aware that people are reading your signs as well. As one of my favorite lyric lines goes, "You're the only Jesus some will ever see."


