No Touch

Harvest Season has arrived on the Northern Plains. Dust is being kicked by combines and trucks alike. People with allergies are heading to the pharmacist. And no one can get anywhere fast with all the farm vehicles moving from field to field.

I was part of the harvest this past couple of weeks. I was given the honor of pulling a grain cart for one of the farmers in the area. For those not familiar with the terminology, "grain carts" are loaded with the grain from the combine so the combine can keep working while the grain cart dumps the grain into the truck bringing the grain to the Elevator. I had fun doing a job which is totally different than my own and working with a great (and very patient) crew.

One of the "rules" of harvesting, and one which tries the patience of the experienced farmers, is the "no touch rule." The rule basically says, "Thou shalt not touch any part of the vehicle in your control with any part of any other vehicle working the harvest." It might sound simple and obvious, but it can be a tough rule to keep when trying to fill a grain truck to its maximum capacity or you lose concentration going in your 10th hour of driving next to the combine.

Rules like this one are tough to keep in relationships as well. For example, the "No Touch Rule" is good for church meetings in trying not to touch a "raw nerve" or "personal issue." The rule might be good when talking with someone about a part of family history or a personal experience. The "No Touch Rule" might be good in these situations.

But we must always realize we are humans who say and do things which can always hit a nerve or "set someone off." Our Men's Bible Study just finished a study of I Corinthians 11 covering some of the "pet peeves" of the Christians in Corinth. The Apostle Paul's advice on the "No Touch Rule" was to remember the core of the faith being Jesus Christ. We can easily get caught up in the "small stuff" of life and worrying if we offend someone by even the smallest of remarks, but this will only divide and hurt the church as it did in Corinth.

The farmer I worked for this past week said, "It is only when the little touch becomes a big touch that we have real problems."

That's good advice. See you in church!
