FAT TUESDAY

I woke up this morning to the sounds of the voices on ESPN talking about today being "Fat Tuesday" (better known as the day before Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent). One of the anchors of the program was talking about the big meals he was going to have for lunch and dinner "to spoil himself before he has to give up something for Lent."

While in seminary, a good friend of mine suggested I give up something for Lent and put aside the money I would have spent on "that something" for a charitable cause. After thinking about it, I gave up soda pop and chocolate for Lent that year. Of course, I drank and ate as much chocolate and soda pop as I possibly could on Fat Tuesday. In fact, I might have spent as much on that Tuesday as I ended up giving to the church at the end of Lent for the chocolate and soda pop I had "given up."

In case you were wondering, Lent is a time of discipline and serious contemplation about our relationship with God and His Son, Jesus Christ. It is a season to concentrate on that relationship and how we live it out. Fat Tuesday, on the other hand as you might have guessed, is the day given to "run-away celebrations," last minute indulgences, and any other type of non-Lenten activity a person could do.

The health insurance plan for United Methodist clergy has started a program this year called "Healthmiles" in which participants are rewarded for healthy behavior. The "catch" to the program is a person is only rewarded after consistent, long-term participation in the program. Days like "Fat Tuesday" are discouraged because they lead to old habits.

Ever since that first Lent in which I gave up something, I have wondered about the indulgences of Fat Tuesday and the sacrifices of Lent. While they are fun to talk about, it seems to me we are missing the real message of Fat Tuesday and the Season of Lent – we should practice the "discipline" of Lent a little more throughout the year and avoid the indulgences of Fat Tuesday whenever those temptations arise. God Bless!







GROTON AD COUNCIL FEB NOTES

The board discussed proper management of heating costs between gas and electric to assure we do not lose our dual heat status as contracted with by the city and still assure we are utilizing the lowest cost heating source as much as possible.

The board has decided it was prudent to pay off our current curb & gutter balance with the city in order to save on interest payments.

Approval was given to Pastor Rob to proceed with administering a congregational survey that the General Council on Finance & Administration has asked a number of churches at random to do. Pastor Rob did assure the council that all input received on the survey is confidential.

There was agreement amongst the council members that the church should again support the cost of camping for our youth by paying 75% of the camping fees.

The results of the annual audit were reviewed by the audit commit-

tee. They cited a few opportunities along with recommendations to improve recording keeping in the future as well as make it easier for the audit committee to complete the audit in the future. The board gave its approval to the audit report as presented.
