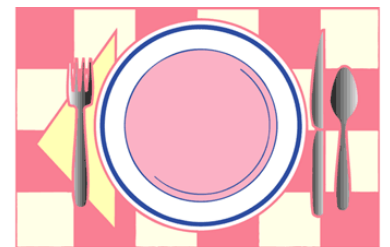

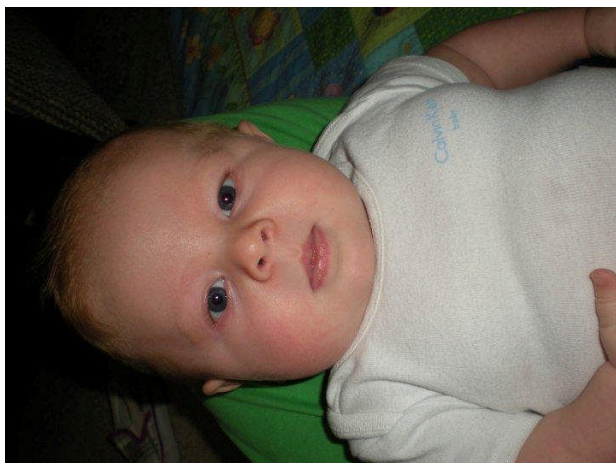

Groton UMW March Meeting

The Groton United Methodist Women met at the church Wednesday afternoon, March 17. President Gloria Pharis opened the meeting and the PURPOSE was recited.

JoAnn Krueger presented an Easter program celebrating the gathering of the women at the tomb, and using that gathering as an example of a discipleship call to mission and the creation of a community where all are welcome, loved, and treated as equal.

The Groton ladies participated in the World Day of Prayer service at the Emmanuel Lutheran Church on March 5. Groton’s UMW will host the meeting next spring and the program will focus on Chile.

Jolene Townsend, chairman of the Social Action committee, attired in the “Go Green” theme, reminded everyone to keep in mind water and the problems this spring, especially urging all to watch over flushing of toilets, unnecessary laundry, and taking of long showers. Marlys Rodman, chairman of the Education and Interpretation committee, said health kits will be collected again due to the great need. Grocery receipts for the school, pop tabs, and box tops for education would be greatly appreciated. Sharon Wheating, Program Resources chairman, informed members that 2005 and older books are no

longer part of the reading program. Other books not available through the conference are The Shack, Three Simple Rules, A Single Thread, Mulberry Park, Bread, Body, and Spirit, Methodism in Recovery, and My Faith So Far.

A May Breakfast planning meeting was held March 3, with the menu being planned and other details discussed.

A box for the collection of undergarments for all ages, “Undies for a Month of Sundays” will be placed in the narthex. The garments will be distributed to mission centers in the Dakotas.

Focus Days will be held in Redfield on April 17. The planners for the day have asked the Groton unit to present a skit. The Prayer Vigil is May 4th; with Groton’s time 2:45 to 3:30 p.m. pray that everyone has access to clean water.

At the next meeting, April 21, Groton’s shepherdess, Kay Haar, will visit. Members were invited to let her know of special things or questions she could discuss.

Lunch after the meeting was served by Sharon Wheating and Rose Tewksbury. Pat Dahlquist and Mary Swisher are hostesses for the April meeting.

Focus Day is April 17 in Redfield: our unit is to present a skit in the morning program. May 2 is Senior Sunday to invite the graduates from our community for the worship.

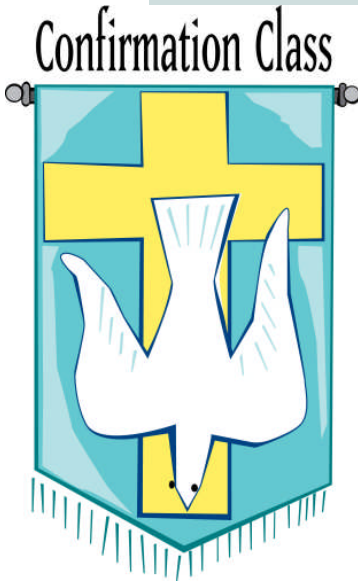

Native American Ministries Sunday recognizes and supports the contributions of Native Americans to the church and society. The observance, approved by the 1988 General Conference, is one of six special church wide Sunday offerings,

The funds collected will allow The United Methodist Church to partner with existing native ministries and create programs on behalf of Native Americans. Money collected also supports seminary scholarships for United Methodist Native Americans.

50% of the offering **remains in the annual conference** to develop and strengthen local Native American minis-

tries. Should no such ministries exist within the conference, the offering is remitted in full to the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA). The funds are then distributed equally between the United Methodist Board of Higher Education and Ministry to provide scholarships for American Indians attending the church's schools of theology and the Native American Urban Initiative of the General Board of Global Ministries.

Approximately 19,000 United Methodists identify themselves as Native American. About 225 United Methodist churches, fellowships, and ministries that relate to this population.
