


Groton Sunday School Program is December 18th during Church.

Groton Ad Council - Nov

Alan Strom presented the proposed 2012 budget and explained that it has increased approximately 2% over the 2011 budget. After discussing some specifics of the budget, the council approved it to be presented at the annual charge conference.

Lon Gellhaus gave an explanation of the Groton United Methodist Church Endowment Fund. He explained that the purpose of the fund is for unforeseen major expenses or for large building needs. Lon explained that there is no minimum

amount required when giving to the fund and that gifts are tax deductible.

Clare Brotherton reported that our average church attendance is less year-to-date in 2011 than it was in 2010. The council had a good discussion on possible ways to increase attendance.

The council also discussed possible ways to address special cleaning duties now assigned to monthly work committee families, but no specific solutions were decided on.
