

# Health Kits - Collecting in Feb & March

- I hand towel 15" X 25" to 17" X 27" (kitchen, cleaning, and microfiber towels not acceptable)
- I washcloth
- I comb (comb needs to be sturdy and at least 8" long, no pocket combs or picks please. Rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable)
- I metal nail file or clipper (no emery boards or toenail clippers please)
- I bath size soap (3 oz and larger sizes only, all brands are acceptable, do not remove from original packaging)
- I toothbrush (adult size only and do not remove from original packaging)

- 6 adhesive bandages (3/4" to 1" size of common household band aids)
- I plastic bag one gallon size (sealable bags only)
- \$1 to purchase toothpaste

All items must be new. Do not wash any of the items as they will be considered used.

If you would rather donate money rather than buy items, please give to Donna Hearnen in Conde and to Kay Brandt in Groton. Thank you for all your support with helping UMCOR provide these kits. They have been used in many emergency situations here in the US and abroad.


