


Dear Friends at Groton and Conde,

In just a few days, the season of Lent begins. Many of us will look to giving something up for the season of Lent. A few years ago the trend began, that rather than giving something up, people instead would take something on. The purpose of all of this is to draw us closer to God, to develop spiritual disciplines, and grow in our awareness of that which is truly necessary to live out our faith in God.

Actually one of the early Christian traditions observed during the season of Lent was that all new believers would undergo a season of instruction and discernment before they could be baptized. This "period of discernment and preparation" would include fasting, prayer, the reading



of scripture and daily fellowship with believers.

Sounds pretty intense huh? Well back in the day, this was tradition, this was routine. It was how new believers became full members in the body of Christ; the Church. And those who had been a part of the community, for a longer period of time, also took on a spiritual practice as a way of solidarity with the new believers and as way of remembering their own spiritual journey into the faith.

To read and understand some of the differences between the Church of today and the Church of long ago helps us to see how the Church, long ago, grew exponentially, where as today mainline churches are seeing a decline in interest and membership. Our spiritual practices seem to have lost meaning and relevancy.

It is my hope that during this season of Lent we will able to re-claim the meaning found in the traditions. That we can live out our faith with boldness and purpose; realizing a sense of nostalgia found in our Christian DNA.

An emphasis was placed on the role of UMCOR(United Methodist Committee on Relief) following the devastating 2010 earthquake in this poverty stricken island country. UMCOR is almost always one of the first organizations into one of these areas of devastation and without hesitation led a massive relief effort in Haiti. With the help of the Methodist Church Haitians will find the strength to help themselves in the rebirth and recovery of their island nation.

President Gloria Pharis opened the business meeting with the members reciting the Purpose. The minutes and financial reports were read and approved.

The Spiritual Growth Committee reported that plans are being made for The World Day of Prayer which is to be held at the Methodist Church on Mar. 4th. UMW Sunday is to be held Feb. 20th. Health Kits - Conde Collecting - March

- I hand towel 15" X 25" to 17" X 27" (kitchen, cleaning, and microfiber towels not acceptable)
- I washcloth
- I comb (comb needs to be sturdy and at least 8" long, no pocket combs or picks please. Rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable)
- I metal nail file or clipper (no emery boards or toenail clippers please)
- I bath size soap (3 oz and larger sizes only, all brands are acceptable, do not remove from original packaging)
- I toothbrush (adult size only and do not remove from original packaging)

- 6 adhesive bandages (3/4" to 1" size of common household band aids)
- I plastic bag one gallon size (sealable bags only)
- \$1 to purchase toothpaste

All items must be new. Do not wash any of the items as they will be considered used.

- 5-gallon bucket with re-sealable lid (Buckets from restaurants can be used if washed and cleaned. Do not use buckets that have stored chemicals such as paint)
- Bleach 2-1 qt or 1-82 oz
- 1 scrub brush
- 18 cleaning towels (handi wipes or reusable wipes, no terry cleaning towels)
- 1 12-16 oz household cleaner that can be mixed with water, no sprays
- 2 pair rubber gloves (med and large)

 pair of work gloves
 bag roll heavy duty trash bags 33-45 gal
 or 9 oz can air freshener (aerosol must have protective cap)
 Liquid Laundry Detergent (1-25 oz)
 scouring pads (3M Donation?)
 Pkg of Sponges (3M Donation?)
 Dust Masks (3M Donation?)

Cost is \$300/person and this covers meals and lodging for the week.



We will also commemorate our 125 year history by using the theme of "Walking a 125 Year Path" at various annual events throughout the year.


The committee is asking for your help

Groton Ad Council - February

The Memorial Committee reported that they have created a list of wants that could be funded by memorial contributions. They will also be investigating ways to update and display previous memorial gifts. The council also had additional suggestions for good uses of undesignated memorial funds.

Our Education Committee is preparing for several special occasions including Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday, Confirmation, and Graduation Recognition. The committee will also be discussing plans for Vacation Bible School.

Pastor Matt spoke about the activities of our UMYF, including a planned ski retreat which will include youth from Claremont/ Hecla and possibly Bath. There is also a March 11-13 middle-high youth rally in Jamestown that Pastor is encouraging our youth to attend.

A March 25-26 two-day seminar in Watertown is planned and Pastor Matt would like to attend along with three leaders. It will focus on re-energizing congregations.

The council discussed and approved funding 75% of the cost for the summer camping experiences of our youth.


