





Friends and Family from Haiti

It has been about a month since I have been back home in Haiti. The first two weeks Cassie, a friend of mine from camp was here to work with Living Media International. She spent time getting to know the community, being introduced to Creole (with many teachers), playing with the Kids Clubs and assisting with English classes. She has plans of returning next year to continue working with Education. After she left I have been trying to settle into some sort of routine, easier said than done in Haiti.

I assist in teaching 3-5 English Classes a week. We have a Haitian Teachers and I help with pronouncing the words and correcting if maybe the teacher does not know exactly. A couple of days one of the teachers had to be gone and I managed to teach the classes with my limited Creole and their limited English. I really enjoy teaching English, because it is hard to learn a second language – I know. You see some students struggle and then all of a sudden they have it. It is a great reward – teachers are amazing people – to all you who are teachers - thank you.

There are also, the weekend Kids Club program. There is one on Saturday in La Voute and one here in Mizak on Sunday afternoons. One week we taught 'Awesome God' to the kids in La Voute and worked with them on their numbers in English. We had a little competition dividing them into three groups - Brazil, Haiti, and France. Then of course United States -Cassie and I had to say the numbers in Creole. They really got into the game and were pretty good at their numbers. Last week at the Kids Club here in Mizak. Christy Pill (another American that was down here for 3 months teaching dance) and I did some stretching and dance exercises with the kids. There is Haitian Limbo and American Limbo both completely different so we played those games too. I am excited about working on some programming with the groups to work on creativity and some general things on how to teach children and be supportive. If anyone has any ideas for curriculum or creative activities please let me know.

Some, although not enough of my time has been spent working online. It is difficult to work on the computer without electricity. I am able to go to internet 1-2 times a week for 2-4 hours. But this is also the time the computer gets charged which gives me another 1-2 hours. This is also for work and personal. It seems that it is difficult to get away when there is always something going on, on the mountain. And yet I want to share with you about all that is going



on, on the mountain. It is an interesting balance between two worlds. But we are working on getting solar power/wind power at the Living Media Center so that will help. I am also starting to work on projects to advertise other ways people can get involved such as the new school that Living Media International just took under its wing last year and the Kids Sponsorship, since school is starting just around the corner. Always busy with something.

Yesterday I helped kill a chicken and go through all the steps of cleaning and cooking the chicken, including tying up the cat. Today I took pictures of a little

baby for her mother to be printed. There are not many places where you can get pictures taken in Haiti. You never know where the day might lead you. Who knows what tomorrow will bring; I just continue to try and be open, listen and learn and have a good sense of humor about it all.

Thank You for being here with me and learning and growing along the way as well. It is so good to be able to share with you and I enjoy hearing from you as well. Hope this finds you well and many blessings for our loved ones' futures.
