# Native American Ministries Sunday - April 22

Spiritual Connections is a youthmentoring project of the faith-based Sacred Pathways Inc. in Robeson County, N.C., that provides food and other basic needs to low-income people. While its roots are among the Lumbee people, the project is racially diverse, like the county it serves.

Supported by United Methodists through the Native American Ministries Sunday offering, Sacred Pathways counsels and nurtures young people, teaching them to work crossculturally to improve their lives and their communities. That includes seeking answers to widespread poverty and decreasing numbers of school dropouts, teen pregnancies and gangs.

Members of the interracial Youth Leadership Cabinet, drawn from area high schools, learn critical thinking skills, team building, self-esteem and personal goal setting. They also learn to respond creatively to concerns such as saving the environment and fighting global hunger and homelessness. "This program taught me so much that I will take with me wherever I go," says Lauren Oxendine, 19, who made new friends and discovered a passion for community service as a cabinet member. "I want to

broaden my horizons, share my culture and all that I've learned, and try to show people there can be a better life for everybody."

# **Missionary Angelica Laudermith**

### Friends and Family~

There is so much always going on in Haiti, many different activities to share. But yesterday I spent some time at my house because my back has been hurting. Although, it wasn't like I was really relaxing. After breakfast we got a call from Lee that he needed to borrow our water barrel from the house, for the construction of the new primary school. Much to my surprise and joy, I looked over at the water barrel and it was full of water. I knew that rain on the tin roof had woke me up and kept me up for part of the night but I had no idea just how much. So the next hour or more was spent scrubbing gallon water jugs that used to hold oil and had been tossed to the side of the kitchen. I sat down on a little chair to the ground and filled a tub of water with soap and bleach and scrubbed and scrubbed. Papi rinsed and Philo and he filled the gallon jugs with water. There were at least 2 dozen plus a couple 5 gallon Culligan jugs and 5 gallon buckets. After it was all said and done we had a lot of water and an empty barrel. I even wore a silly hat because the family was worried about all the sun I was getting. In the afternoon one of the teams on the mountain came to shop in the Art Gallery.

You never know what the day will look like exactly. I have a schedule of English Classes, Typing classes, and Literacy Art Class; but beyond that it is an adventure. Lately I have been trying to be adventurous in the kitchen too for cooking different types of foods. Last night we ate cheeseburgers. It was incredible and very American feeling. Today I most definitely want my good ol' rice and beans. I have also made Alfredo, Eggplant parmesan, and egg salad sandwiches. Eugenie (Gabriel) is an amazing cook and has also done Lasagna, pizza, and ham salad sandwiches; soon we are going to make some Stroganoff. Eugenie is very excited to learn knew foods to cook and I am constantly amazed at what she is capable of cooking over charcoal.

Typing classes are going well. We have

just started with the Living Media Staff and some friends (that I had started with last year); but word has gotten out and I have had many people ask me about them. We have 4 laptops left for LMI to use after Haiti Hope House (HHH) finished with a basic computer class at our center. It was a true blessing and has opened up a new world of possibilities for some of the young people in the community; with a plan for a future computer lab we will be able to have more classes.

The Art/Craft class started with some of the ladies from the Creole Literacy class is going well too. Trying to work with them on how art can be used as a medium for expressing yourself and maybe making an impact on your community. For too long what they know about art/crafts is the price. This does make sense in a community of a job shortage; however art could be both self expressions, have a meaning and have a good price for selling. It has been so beautiful to watch them work and discover. Last week we just played with shapes. We had markers, chalk, pipe cleaners, and play dough donated by previous teams. They were very excited to make letters out of pipe cleaners and play dough being proud of their knowledge of the letters.

I am always energized by my English Classes every weekend and always looking for different activities to help them learn in creative ways. That is much of the rest of my time in Haiti – I spend researching and studying how I can help the students better. I have learned to adore reading it helps me soak up so much knowledge and is a bit of an escape when needed.

Thank you as always for your donations and prayers. I feel blessed everyday to be able to do this work. Hope this finds you well and hopeful for the future.




## Sink or swim
