Dear Friends in Groton and Conde

On my recent trip to Kansas City for the Leadership Institute at The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection, I experienced renewal. Aside from the workshops and intentional conversations on ministry, I was reconnecting with friends from seminary as well as with colleagues in the conference both clergy and laity. It was truly a refreshing experience. But there was more.

Rev. Adam Hamilton, who is the Lead/Sr. pastor at COR spoke during the general sessions and helped us all focus and reflect on the story of John Wesley and the early Methodist movement. The goal of the Wesley's and The Oxford Holy Club was to bring about renewal in the Anglican Church (which later became the Anglican/Episcopal Church of England. In fact the word Methodist began its use as a derogatory word meant to deride and defame the Wesley's and their "methodical approaches to the Christian faith." And unfortunately, instead of church renewal, a schismatic movement dividing the church was the end result.

It seems that whenever the church is called by the Holy Spirit to move forward with a ministry or try something new, the traditionalists hunker down and hold strong to their way of doing things. Rather, as a congregation we should be discerning together and listening to God's voice about worship, evangelism, discipleship. Young families and youth are not only the future of the church but

they are also a part of the present life of our congregations. And something new is taking place. The lake is turning over and we have an opportunity to all be a part of it.

That being said, on the way home as we were riding the bus from Kansas City to Sioux Falls, a holy occurrence took place. Half-way through the ride home, there were 6 or 7 of us that gathered in the back of the bus and we spontaneously began singing wonderfully old, wonderfully traditional, wonderful hymns. We were singing acapella, and filling the bus with bus with song. These were songs that we all knew because of our Methodist Tradition. And before we knew how much time had passed or how many songs we had sung, others were saying that it was the best 3 hrs on a bus that they had experienced.

A three hour impromptu acapella hymn sing, something so traditional, but something that felt so new and invigorating, contemporary. The power of the Holy Spirit at work, using something well known and traditional but placing it in a new fresh and joy filled light. And we all shared in the journey!


We will have local judges decide the winning pot that Sunday during church so at the end of the service, the winner will be announced! And a prize will be given.






