Mother Teresa once shared the following story, from her book "In the Heart of The World." Pgs 71-72

The other day, two friends of mine came to see me. They brought me a large amount of money to use for feeding the poor. I asked them, "Where did you get all this money?" They answered, "We were married two days ago, but before that we had decided not to have a large wedding banquet. As a witness of our love for each other, we wanted to bring this money to Mother Teresa." This is the greatness of young people! They are so generous! I asked them further, "Why did you do this?" They answered, "We love each other so much, and we wanted to share our love with other people, especially with those you are serving."

This season of Lent has been a journey that has allowed us to recognize that without a loving community to help us in times of trouble, the depths of despair would be deeper. Isn't the loving action of the young couple in Mother Teresa's story amazing to think about? What a wonderfully selfless act of unconditional love! Using the money that had been set aside for a huge wedding feast and instead letting God direct the use of their money!

This young couple certainly had their priorities directed by their faith and love for God and people. Our lives are certainly busy, and especially for our parents and young families in the church. You all have certainly been on my mind and in my prayers. I hope you have found time to prioritize your lives according to your faith and love for God and people. We all need this. Life is crazy at times.

We even see in scripture where Jesus himself needed time away for devotion and to re-center and recharge the batteries. Jesus recognized after he fed the 5,000 that he needed to go off to a place where he could commune with God. (John 6:1-15) Jesus had his priorities centered on God and the calling from God to love all people and he knew that if he didn't take time to recharge the struggle with temptation would be much greater.

We see Jesus giving of himself, emptying himself and then taking time for renewal. And all of this foreshadows his great sacrifice on that dark, bleak but blessed Friday when he gave himself up for us, only to rise again on the 3rd day. May you recognize the priority of God in your life and find ways to give sacrificially, knowing that through dying to self and giving of one-self, new life is found!


Groton Sunday School Mission Projects

W.E. Sangster (1900-1960), a well-known pastor in England, contracted a progressive, incurable muscle disease. He lost the ability to move his legs, and eventually his voice faded away. Because Sangster wanted to continue serving God even though he could no longer preach, he became a prolific writer and organized prayer cells throughout England.

On Easter morning, shortly before his death, Sangster wrote a note to his daughter in an unsteady hand. "It is terrible to wake up on Easter morning and have no voice to shout, 'He is risen!'" he wrote. "But it would be still more terrible to have a voice and not want to shout."



What you need:

- Adult help
 Box of cake mix (any
- flavor)
 Tub of brown frosting
- Shredded coconut
- Green food coloring
- Chocolate Hostess Ding Dong cupcake
- Donut hole
- Pretzel sticks
- M&M's candies

What you do:

- 1. Bake cake in rectangular pan. When cool, frost it.
- Pour coconut into bowl. Add drops of green food coloring. Mix until coconut resembles grass.
- 3. In one corner of cake, set Ding Dong upright to resemble a tomb. Place donut hole in front of it, to one side.
- Make three crosses with six pretzel sticks and some frosting. Arrange on opposite corner from tomb.
- 5. Use brown M&M's to make a path from the crosses to the tomb.
- 6. Use other colors of M&M's to spell out "Jesus lives!"



A foretaste of the feast

While teaching a group of First Communion students about the Lord's Supper, a pastor gave each child one M&M's candy at the beginning of class. "Eat it!" he invited, before proceeding to teach.


Near the end of the session, the pastor asked the students what they'd thought of the earlier treat. "Good!" said one. "I wanted more!" another admitted. "I wanted a whole bag!" chimed in a third.

"Now you understand another thing about Holy Communion," the pastor said. He drew out of his supplies a full bag of M&M's for each stu-

dent. "Sometimes we call Communion 'a foretaste of the feast to come.'" Indeed, he explained, God promises that one day we'll feast together with Jesus in heaven, but until



then, Communion is that delicious little taste of what the feast will be like. We're left wanting more because we have "[tasted] and [seen] that the LORD is good" (Psalm 34:8).





An Organized Response

Some people today reject the idea of belonging to a church by saying, "I'm spiritual but not part of any organized religion."

It may be cute to respond by saying, "Well, you'd like our church. We're the most disorganized group of people you could imagine." But what a putdown to the body of Christ.

Instead, try saying this: "I really enjoy our church. We have something for everyone. I've learned so much and get a lift for living every week." Briefly point out what has been most helpful and meaningful to you. Then offer to take the person to worship with you as your guest.

The glory of spring

A pastor looked out his study window and was smitten by the glory of spring bursting forth all around him. He recalled a story about a Jewish doctor freed from a Nazi concentration camp.

The doctor began walking along a country road and was captivated by the green meadows, the wildflowers, the singing birds. He felt touched by the master artist's work in nature. He was becoming a healthy human being again, instead of a victim of horror and hate.
