# Dear Friends

Stress, it is a part of all of our lives, and there is no way around it. But we do pass through it. How do you handle stress? Often it is the case that we can get so focused on our own stuff and everything that we are dealing with that we fail to see the other needs around us, and we miss things completely. Or if it's not the needs of others around us, we may forget that we are blessed? We focus so much on the stress, pain, or we get so caught up in the moment we forget all the ways God is working in our lives. We forget to count our blessings.

In many ways we as a parish, meaning the churches of Groton and Conde, bless each other. God is at work in both churches and we see that evidence through our ministries and through our relationship with each other. We are really blessed to be connected as a yoked parish.

I remember when I was young  $(4^{\text{th}}-6^{\text{th}})$ grade) and playing with friends at the house or in the yard, my mom saying play nice! This usually meant that she was working on a task or that she would be leaving to go to work or shopping, something along those lines. It was as though she was trying to establish simple guidelines so that we would remember to respect each other while she was gone; her way of reminding us to be mindful of each other because she wasn't there and couldn't supervise. If we were to put her words "play nice" into a God context we might say that God tells us to play nice with each other and that means to bless one another.

We need to remember that we are a blessing to each other. I just gave a lesson in Confirmation on the Beatitudes. The scripture reference is Matthew 5:1-12, we read these words, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful for they will receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Despite our stresses and frustrations we need to remember that we are called "blessed." Have you counted your blessings? What are the collective blessings that we share in together as a yoked parish? Both Groton and Conde UM Churches can share with and strengthen each other. May it be so, according to the Grace given to us by God.

### **Persevering Faith**

In the movie *Monumental*, Kirk Cameron describes what led the Pilgrims to leave England and Holland for America — as well as the conditions they faced along the way. While on the cramped, storm-tossed Mayflower, they signed the Mayflower Compact, attesting that they came "for the glory of God and advancements of the Christian faith."

Within months in the new land, 47 of the original 121 Pilgrims had died. Only six or seven could

walk and care for the others, and only four adult women were still alive for the first Thanksgiving. But the Pilgrims persevered, thanks to their faith in God and help from Native Americans.

William Bradford, governor of Plymouth Colony for 30 years, experienced hardship firsthand; his wife was one of the first to die during the journey. Yet Bradford's tomb bears the bold message that "Jehovah is our help."

and separated, as it were, from all the world to be miserable." Yet the corresponding "good" puts things into perspective: "But I am singled out too from all the ship's crew to be spared from death; and he that miraculously saved me from death can deliver me from this condition."

When you're tempted to hold a pity party, step back and thank God, your Rescuer, for all the blessings he provides.




