

Conde VBS

From May 26-29, 40 children from the Conde community had a cool ‘mountain top’ experience as they attending Vacation Bible School with the theme of “**EVEREST- Conquering Challenges with God’s Mighty Power.**”

Each day the crews gathered together at Base Camp Sing & Play for a time to sing, dance, and celebrate God’s mighty power. The rest of time was spent at stations where the Bible point for the day was expanded upon. Conde UMCOR Kits

August is the time to be buying items for the School Kits, as many of those things are on sale. During the year, we did not set a special time to collect things for Health Kits, so those items could also be purchased. Mid-September is the deadline for collecting things and packing them in boxes. It has worked quite well in the past two years for Conde to take their boxes to First United Methodist Church while the truck that transports the kits and other items to the UMCOR Depots is in Aberdeen. If you are interested in donating to this Mission Project, and do not want to shop, money will be accepted, and the Mission Committee will buy the items. The website for UMCOR is stating that there is a shortage of both kinds of kits. They like to have a supply of Health Kits on hand, so that when a need arises, they can meet it right away. If you are interested in reading more about UMCOR and how they operate, just go to that website. They are an organization that is there when disaster strikes, not just with kits, but in many other ways. This is a Mission Project that the Conde Church has supported for many years. It not only helps adults and children in other countries, but also here in the United States.

There has also been a suggestion to put together some school kits for children in the community who might find it hard to afford the list of items that some schools require. This would be a separate collection.

Following is a list of things for each kind of kit. Please note the special instructions on some of the items.

Health Kits - 1 hand towel 15 x 25 inches to 17 x 27 inches (Kitchen, cleaning, and microfiber towels not acceptable); 1

washcloth; 1 comb (Comb needs to be sturdy and longer than 6 inches long and No pocket combs or picks please. Rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable with a minimum of 6 inches of teeth); 1 metal nail file or nail clippers (No emery boards, please); 1 bath-size soap (3 oz. and larger sizes only and No Ivory or Jergens soap due to moisture content and Do not remove from original packaging); 1 toothbrush (Adult size only and Do not remove from original packaging); 6 adhesive bandages $\frac{3}{4}$ inch to 1 inch-size common household Band-Aids; 1 plastic bag One-gallon size sealable bag only; AND \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste


School Kits - 1 pair blunt scissors (Rounded tip only; No plastic scissors); 3 pads of paper Spiral- or top-bound pads (150 sheets or less of loose-leaf paper can be substituted for 1 pad Combination of spiral, top-bound, side-bound, or loose-leaf paper is acceptable No composition books); 1 hand-held pencil sharpener (Must be at least 1 inch long Remove from packaging); 1 30-centimeter ruler Hard or flexible (Cartoon characters are acceptable No advertisements); 6 unsharpened pencils (No advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols; Cartoon characters are acceptable); 1 2-inch or larger-size eraser (No advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols, Cartoon characters are acceptable); 1 24-count box of crayons Only 24-count boxes; 1 14x16 inch cloth bag Homemade or purchased bags are both acceptable;

Reverse economy

In *Love Does* (Thomas Nelson), Bob Goff describes his childhood interactions with a storekeeper. Goff would choose some candy, spread his change on the counter and let the man count out what was owed. One morning, judging by the man's face, Goff could tell there wasn't enough money.

“We're one penny short,” the storekeeper said. After a long pause, he took one of Goff's pennies, rubbed it with some vinegar and revealed a coin that looked brand new. Returning it to the pile, the man said, “In my store, shiny pennies are worth double.”

Goff says that was an important lesson about Christians' role in Jesus' economy, where the poor are rich and we must give to receive: “We get to decide that people, including ourselves, are worth more than others might figure and that following Jesus means doing the math differently sometimes,” he writes. “Because actually we're all on the same side of the counter when it comes to needing a little help and grace and a shiny penny now and then.”

New Business: Welcome basket: It was decided that UMW would put together a welcome basket and food to be available on July 1 when Pastor Thomas and Britni arrive. Jolene will mail a card to them in advance of their arrival from the UMW letting them know we are looking forward to their arrival. Darlys volunteered to set up a large tote bag on the blessings shower table for church members to contribute non-perishable items for a welcome basket to the pastor and his wife.

Charitable Items: On a motion by Jan Raap & 2nd by Marjorie Overacker, it was agreed to donate \$100 to the BAGS program and \$100 to the Groton Family Crisis Fund. These donations will be made now versus at the end of the year.




