A Broken Body

The video for "Broken Together," a contemporary Christian song by Casting Crowns, features a married couple struggling through a lifetime of faults and failings. But the song's message applies to church families, as well, according to lead singer Mark Hall.

Instead of trying to appear perfect and put -together on Sundays, he says, Christians need to be real with one another in an honest, "broken together" community.

"In community," Hall says, "we can tear

the plastic off and just be ourselves. We can say, 'You know what, we don't have it all together at our house, and it's kind of a mess. But Jesus lives in this mess, and he's walking with us through it."

School Kit Materials

1 pair blunt scissors

Rounded tip only; No plastic scissors, please.

3 pads of paper

Spiral- or top-bound pads; 150 sheets or less of loose-leaf paper can be substituted for 1 pad;

Combination of spiral, top-bound, side-bound, or loose-leaf paper is acceptable; No composition books, please.

1 hand-held pencil sharpener

Must be at least 1 inch long; Remove from packaging.

1 30-centimeter ruler

Hard or flexible:

Cartoon characters are acceptable; No advertisements please.

6 unsharpened pencils

No advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols, please; Cartoon characters are acceptable.

1 2-inch or larger-size eraser

No advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols, please; Cartoon characters are acceptable.

1 24-count box of crayons

Only 24-count boxes, please.

1 14x16 inch cloth bag

Homemade or purchased bags are both acceptable;

Heavy-duty fabric only, such as denim, corduroy, drapery fabric, etc.; No advertisements, religious, patriotic, military, or camouflage symbols, please; Closures are optional but must be buttons, snaps, or Velcro sewn in middle of opening, if used.


