
# Groton Online Church Directory

Chairman Brad Morehouse called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. In attendance were Alan and Jolene Townsend, Richard Krueger, Marjorie Overacker, Roger Rix, Karla Pasteur, Amanda Morehouse, Pastor Brandon Dunham, Jane Johnson, Meri Erickson, and Diann Morehouse. Pastor Brandon shared a prayer before the business meeting began.

**Treasurer's Report:** Marjorie Overacker reported that she & Pastor Brandon will be working with the conference to assure going forward the treasurer's report is uniform regardless of who is our church treasurer. The Treasurer's report was approved.

**Pastor Parish:** Meri Erickson reported they ended the year with some money. Pastor Brandon's expenses are lower – due to his age.

**Bills to be paid:** Bills totaling \$260.91 were approved for the Christmas program meal.

Administrative Report: Pastor Brandon discussed the new committee member nominations. Approval for nominations with the change of Brent Morehouse and Lon Gellhaus as Co-Chairmans of the PPRC was given by the council.

#### New Business:

Rosewood Visitation: Pastor Brandon said he took the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday and Saturday to go to Rosewood. The new part-time pastors in the community were going to take the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday.

Pastor Brandon discussed the coat collection project. His vision was to do a "one thing ministry" and then have an event at the Community Center in which people could come and pick up a coat. Most of the coats collected were for adult women. There were very few children's coats collected. He contacted the UMC in Aberdeen. They take their coats to the Reservation and suggested we could join them in that project. There was discussion that Safe Harbor could possibly use the coats. UMW will help do an inventory of the coats.

Pastor Brandon shared a "Thank You" card Kim Weber had dropped off. This was for "special donations" monies that went to the school for classroom libraries.

Richard Krueger motioned for the meeting to adjourn and second Meri Erickson. Meeting adjourned at 8:00.

# Three in One

Everyday objects can serve as simple lessons about biblical truth. To illustrate the profound concept of the Trinity, for example, some teachers use an apple, an egg or a three-leaf clover. During winter, you can point to a kid-friendly snowman to describe how God is Three in One.

The ball of snow on the base represents God the Father, our Creator and strong foundation. The middle ball, with stick arms reaching to the side, reminds us of Jesus, who died on the cross. And the snowman's head stands for the Holy Spirit, our ever-present Counselor who helps us and speaks God's truth to us.

### February 9: God's Love Shown

John 3:16

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

We start this week reading a verse that completely captures the love God has for us. The word "so" at the beginning of this verse emphasizes the intensity and greatness of God's love. God loved the world so deeply that He gave His one and only beloved Son to die on behalf of sinful men and women. If we choose to believe in the Son who died in our place on the cross, we will have eternal life with God, who loved us so much.

Why was it important for God to send His Son Jesus to die for the world? Do you believe in Jesus and God's great love for you?



#### February 10: Love God and Love Others Matthew 22:37-39

"And Jesus said to him, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and will all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the great and foremost commandment. The second is like it, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Today we are reading the very words of Jesus during His time on earth. In this story, a man is asking Jesus what He thinks is the most important Law to be kept. The Old Testament Law consisted of 613 commandments to be strictly followed. While the Pharisees were trying to corner Jesus into which of the 613 commandments was essential to their religion, Jesus instead says that the two most crucial and fundamental beliefs are to love God with all your heart, soul and mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself.

What does it look like to love God with all your heart, mind and soul? Who are your neighbors and how can you love them as yourself?

### February 11: Put on Love

#### Colossians 3:12-14

"So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. Beyond all these things, put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity."

In all that God has done through His Son Jesus for Christians, we are commanded to live our lives with a behavior and attitude that is honoring to God. To "put on" is similar like that of putting on a jacket or t-shirt. In order to be a fully-clothed Christian, we must put on compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Above all though, we are to put on love, which unifies and brings harmony amongst believers.

Which "piece of clothing" is hardest for you to "put on"? In what ways can you bring harmony and unity with others today?

### February 12: Love Ever-Present

Romans 8:38-39

"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus."

God's love has lavishly been poured out to us through His Son, Jesus Christ. This passage highlights and focuses on the security we have in our faith with God. No matter what comes our way, no matter what we have or will do, nothing can separate us from the great love of God. God has put in our hearts the Holy Spirit, which is evidence that we will always belong to Him. Through the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives, we can love the One who first loved us.

What does it mean to have security in your faith with God? How will you live today knowing that nothing can or will separate you from the love of God?

### February 13: Love One Another

John 13:34-35

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Jesus has given this command for us to model the love He has shown us through His death on the cross. Jesus's love for us was a sacrificial, unconditional love. He offered His life in order that we may have eternal life through Him. In the same way, we are to love others sacrificially, even if we feel they don't deserve our love. We are commanded to love others in this way because through our actions, Jesus will be glorified and others will see that we know Jesus as our Savior.

What does it look like to love others sacrificially? Will other people see that you know Jesus by the way that you love?



# **Lenten Sermon Series**

### **Return to Me with All Your Heart**

In this season of formation and preparation, we again approach the 40 days of Lent from a variety of different perspectives and points along the Christian journey. During this season, new and longtime Christians alike hear the call to return to God with all their hearts, thus entering a season historically characterized by much prayer and fasting. These works of discipline have for hundreds of years served as a means by which new converts prepare for baptism, which occurs as a part of the Easter Vigil. Using the words of Wesleyan theology, we believe all this work is initiated by God, who invites us to come before God with all our hearts.


