Hello Church Family,

Do you know which books of the Bible I've read the most? The first 3... The reason being just about every December I have this conviction that I do not read my Bible nearly as much as I should. If I am a follower of Christ then I should behave as someone, well... following. So, I have set a daily Bible reading goal to start January 1st more years than I haven't.

The problem with forming any new habit however is the sustaining nature of the practice until it becomes second nature. Reading your Bible more sounds like a wonderful idea until you realize your body doesn't always get on board as quick as your heart does. Waking up earlier in the day or staying up later in bed... turning off the TV in the evening to have a few moments of intentionality with God and His Word is far more difficult than we want to admit because those practices shake up our established daily rhythm. But it's there that I feel God wanting to speak into me and through me.

What is our rhythm? What are our lives built upon? What are the things that we value the most? Personally, if I cannot bring



myself to spend 15 minutes of my day with my Bible and my Lord, can I really say that He is my priority? If I believe that "every good and perfect gift is from above" (James 1:17) and among those gifts are my wife, friends, family, job, home, food on the table, heart that feels joy, and maybe even greater than all those, purpose for this life... but do not have time to spend with God in thankfulness and in council to know how I can share these great gifts with others... am I misleading myself to believe that God is the rock I stand upon?

Thankfully that is where grace meets us time and time again. It meets us through the blessing of unconditional love and it

meets us through His church. We do not go to church out of guilt. We ARE the church because of grace. It is in our church family that we draw near to God and celebrate His goodness. Celebrate His faithfulness. Celebrate the ways He is moving in the people around us. And draw near to one another in the midst of struggle and pain. It's not just a habit that needs to be started it's a home that is waiting for



Both these projects also involved meters, cables, bracket, wall mounts,


and labor, so thank you to all who remember memorials to the church in honor of their family and friends.

Connections Across the Dakotas: Meet Bishop Laurie Haller

Bishop Laurie Haller is serving as the interim bishop for the Dakotas Conference. She also serves as the resident bishop for the Iowa Area of The United Methodist Church.

In this video interview, she shares about her ministry journey. "I never would have imagined that I would be a bishop serving the United Methodist Church," says Bishop Haller.

She grew up in the Mennonite faith, and had uncles and great uncles who were pastors. When Bishop Laurie went to college and graduate school, she felt a call to ministry. However, women couldn't be pastors in the Mennonite church.

Bishop Haller initially thought she would be a church organist. She received a Bachelor of Music degree in organ performance from Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where she spent her junior year studying sacred music at the Berliner Kirchenmusikschule in West Berlin, Germany. She also received a

Master of Music degree in organ performance from the Yale University Institute of Sacred Music and School of Music, and a Master of Divinity degree from Yale Divinity School.

For more than 40 years, Bishop Laurie has been striving to run daily. She has run the Boston Marathon 10 times. You can also find her riding bike. She has participated in the Ride Across Iowa (RAGBRAI), marathons and triathlons. She has completed three Ironman triathlons. She does some hiking and climbing and completed the rim-to-rim hike at the Grand Canyon.

Bishop Haller is married to Rev. Gary Haller. They have three children and two grandchildren.


Groton UMC 10 AM Bible Study

Recognize your own place in the story and Passion of Jesus.

Jesus' Passion story is presented each Lent in countless churches every year. But one play presented by the inhabitants of the village of Oberammergau, in Bavaria, Germany, may be one of the longest-running performance of all. Staged every ten years since 1634, the play makes an impact not only on the villagers who portray the characters but on all who see it as well. In *The Passion Play*, Rob Fuquay follows the biblical story of the Passion and shows how this amazing play has been used both as a ritual of praise and later as a weapon through its anti-Semitic past. The book makes a perfect six-week Lenten group study when paired with the Leader Guide and the DVD, which was filmed on location in Germany and contains behind-the-scenes footage of the production.





- Continue In-person Church Services: There were no objections to continuing in-person church services as long as we continue using every other pew and encourage the use of face masks.
