School is back in session. Blurry-eyed kids with loaded backpacks are roaming the streets and getting off buses. Parents, at least for a few hours, get some peace and quiet in the house. I always get a kick out of the blank stares and confused looks when I ask kids, "So what did you learn in your first week of school?" It's almost as if I caught them asking themselves, "You mean I was supposed to learn something at school?"

One of the ways I keep learning is using Bible Gateway's "Verse of the Day" (You can get it delivered to your email each day for free. Sign up at www.biblegateway.com/ newsletters/). Each morning I receive an email with a random bible verse. Sometimes, they are familiar. On the day I'm writing this, the verse was Romans 12:4-5 which is Paul's description of the church as having many parts but one body. Since we recently went through Romans in Sunday morning worship, I passed over the verse for the day.

On the other hand, with school starting this week, yesterday's "Verse of the Day" still has me thinking. Psalm 119:165 states, "Those who love your instruction have great peace and do not stumble." Although it sounds like something found in scripture, I don't recognize it as a "memory verse" from Sunday School or something I heard preached about. But it does make sense for this time of year doesn't it?

And it has me thinking. Someone asked the question on Facebook this week if we still knew the name of our first-grade teacher. I still remember Mrs. Jorgenson. I remember an older lady but not close to retirement who taught me about parts of grammar like "and," "the," "this." I still use those parts of grammar, hopefully in appropriate ways, and I'm glad I can communicate well. I also was asked which books I've been reading recently. I reported I just finished "Why the Jews," a book on anti-Semitism, and "Feherty," a

biography of the golf personality David Feherty, and I'm reading "The Windsor's at War," a history of the English royal family leading up to and during World War II.

What I've realized by the prodding of this verse from the Psalms is that "instruction" and "learning" never end. I keep learning more from scripture as I open up the Word each week. I hope you are doing the same.

My 40th high school reunion is coming up in September. It's hard to believe it's been 40 years since my last day of high school but I'm glad it's never been my last day of learning.

I hope you join us in church as we learn together.




Confirmation Update



ADMINISTRATIVE Council Meeting Groton United Methodist Church 7-19-2023

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, AM Mitchell. Those in attendance were AM Mitchell, Pastor Rob Moorlach, Carna Atherton-Pray, Jeanne Wanous, and Anita Lowary. Past Rob led the group in prayer prior to the business meeting.

<u>Agenda:</u> The agenda was approved on a motion by Anita Lowary. Previous Minutes: The previous minutes were approved on a motion by Carna Atherton-Pray.

Committee Reports:

<u>Membership Committee</u>: Anita will be calling a meeting soon.

Trustees: Committee chair, Tyke Nyberg, was not present, so Pastor Rob gave an update on the tree trimming & removal project. Tyler Sperry has removed the tree in front of the church, a tree near the parsonage, and has trimmed grove trees, including stump removal for a total of \$2200. Tyler noticed five or six dead or diseased trees in the grove and stated he could remove those trees & stumps for an additional \$500. On a motion by Anita Lowary & 2nd by Carna Atherton-Pray, the council voted to remove those additional trees. A portion of the bill will be paid from the Parsonage fund.

<u>Treasurer's Report & Finance</u>: The report was reviewed, and it was noted that we are in need of more member donations.

<u>Pastor Parish</u>: A meeting will be set for after the Brown County Fair. Bills: None

Administrative Report:

Pastor Rob reported that he has been making visits to members of the congregation. He has also had a meeting with the new Emmanuel Lutheran pastor.

Old Business:

<u>Outside Church Sign</u>: The sign has been updated and the bill will be submitted.

<u>CPR Classes and AED</u>. Carna showed the new AED device to the Council. The place to mount it in the church is still undetermined. She is working to establish training and notes there will be a minimum number of people required to attend in order to hold the training class.

<u>Pastor Stained Glass</u>: Anita is working on a person to update the names as well as finding another glass to carry on the listing of pastor's who have served the Groton UMC.

Sound System: A bid of \$3,604.47

(including а \$500 credit for equipment trade-in) from Sound. Pauer LLC in Aberdeen was reviewed and discussed. On a motion by Anita Lowary and 2nd by Car-Athertonna Pray the board agreed to move Groton Stewardship Report June 2023 Average Wkly Giving \$1,217 Needed Wkly for Church Mission \$2,393
