Proverbs 3:5-6 - ⁵ Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; ⁶ in all your ways submit to him, and he will direct your paths. (NIV)

As I write, we are fast approaching high school graduation in Groton, South Dakota. I think the description Garrison Keillor gives to the approaching high school graduation in Lake Wobegon, Minnesota is the same for any community in this area of the country where we live: our graduating children are looking for any excuse to get out of the school building as well as their own homes; their parents, especially the mothers, are frantically putting together “shrines” to be used at receptions consisting of pictures, report cards, awards and honors earned since pre-school days; fathers and siblings are given the task of cleaning out the barn or the Morton Building to be used for the reception and it needs to be so clean that it could pass anyone’s white glove test. It’s a busy time, maybe not for the graduates themselves but certainly for family and others who want to make sure “everything is just right.”

My high school class celebrated its 40th reunion this past year. It seems surreal to think I graduated from high school 40 years ago but that’s what the calendar says. Even though the reunion was just a



few hours away, I did not attend. The only high school classmates I still keep in touch with on a regular basis live near Anchorage Alaska. My friend, Shane, called me a few weeks before the scheduled reunion to say he and Michelle, his wife who also was a classmate, would not be attending since I was the only one they kept in regular contact with from our class. We both agreed that our telephone call would be “our reunion.” We also talked about my plans to go up to see them next Summer. I received an invite and then the news about my class reunion via Facebook. It seems from the many pictures shared from the event that a good time was had by all who attended. The only problem for me, with a couple of exceptions, was I recognized no one in the pictures. They might as well have been strangers on the street. And to

make matters worse, more than half of the names associated with the pictures were totally foreign to me. To be forthcoming, there were 147 people in my graduating class from Brandon Valley High School and most of my friends were in athletics, not drama or music programs. But still, you’d think I would recognize a few people! Nope!

A funny thing happened not long ago which I shared in Sunday morning worship but it also fits here. I was in our high school one day when I noticed the picture Groton High School Class of 1958. I realized this was the year my mother graduated from Glencoe Minnesota High School so these young people of Groton would look much like my mother did at age 18. I was so excited to talk to my mother about this picture I was looking at that I pulled out my cellphone and called

her right then. But when I told what I was looking at, the very first words she said were, “Your brother Brian was just here to help me with my computer.” I was so excited to talk about the class of 1958; all she wanted to do was focus on what was right in front of her. It was like a sharp pin had my popped my excitement balloon. I began to realize my mother and I (along with friends Shane and Michelle) were a long way from where we once were. Thankfully I can report my friends and mother are all people who have been trusting in the Lord since those days long ago and God has certainly directed all of us on some interesting paths.

And this is my prayer for all of our graduates, and each of us: That you will trust in the Lord always and let Him direct your paths.

We are blessed to be a blessing to others—and that is precisely what our annual Miracle Offering is all about: expressing our gratitude for God's provisions in our lives and sharing God's extravagant love with a broken

Each year, churches and individuals in the Dakotas Annual Conference demonstrate their love for God and their neighbors through the Miracle Offering that is presented during worship at our Annual Conference Session. The Miracle Offering will be divided equally to these recipients:

38:1 Project: 31:8 Project's mission is to equip and challenge society to proactively address issues regarding human trafficking. Based in Bismarck, North Dakota, 31:8 offers informative seminars,

conducts research, and creates curriculum applicable to all levels of education and forms of human trafficking. Donation support activities like the Bakken Human Trafficking Summit, mentorships for survivors of human trafficking, and the Demand Reduction Program—an education partnership designed to reduce recidivism.

Abbott House's Bridges Therapeutic Foster Care: In 2013-2014 supporters of Abbot House came together to build Bridges Therapeutic Foster Homes in Mitchell, SD, so young girls could grow up with a family and a home. Today, there are 10 therapeutic foster homes serving, boys and girls, in Mitchell, Rapid City and Sioux Falls. Donations will support continuing efforts for Bridges Therapeutic Foster Care.

Recovery Ministry: Through recovery ministries, people are building their relationship with Christ, and shaping a path to healthy living with those around them. Funds will be granted to United

Methodist churches in the Dakotas Conference engaged in recovery ministry.

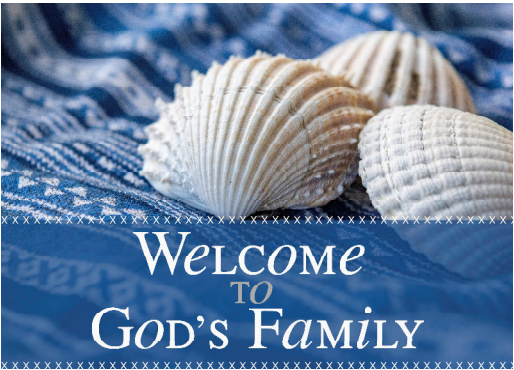

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, AM Mitchell. Those in attendance were Pastor Rob Moorlach, AM Mitchell, Linda Thurston, Anita Lowary, Roger Rix, Val Baker, Allen Walter, and Jeanne Wanous. Pastor Rob shared a prayer prior to the discussion of business.

The agenda was approved on a motion from Anita Lowary.

The previous meeting minutes were approved on a motion from Roger Rix.

Correspondence: Jeanne Wanous shared a thank you note from Brooklyn Spanier for the blanket she received from our church for her recent confirmation.

Committee Reports

Membership: Anita Lowary reported that no additional responses have been received from current members regarding a change in status for current members. She will have an updated report at the next meeting.

Memorial: Linda Thurston reported the following totals:

Undesignated =	\$11,186.40
Designated =	\$15,262.44
Total	= \$26,448.84

Missions: Val Baker stated that she and her Missions Committee are getting ready to make May baskets prior to church on April 24th. The baskets will be delivered to Avantara & Rosewood Court in Groton.

Trustees: Tyke Nyberg received the bill from Heartland Heating & Cooling for re-setting the regulator, cleaning & repair of the boiler that were required after a recent boiler inspection. Also, Tyke has replaced all light bulbs in the hall and foyer with LED bulbs.

Treasurer's Report:

Church Treasurer-Jeanne Wanous: Jeanne reviewed the YTD & EO March treasurer's report. After some discussion and concerns about managing our financ-

es for the balance of the year, it was suggested that the Finance Committee schedule a meeting for further discussion.

Anita Lowary made a motion to have the motion made & approved at the March Ad Council regarding combining the Building Fund & General Fund accounts together rescinded. After her explanation, the motion to rescind was unanimously approved.

Financial Secretary-Allen Walter: Allen volunteered to give a short Estate Planning message at an upcoming church service in the future if the council was interested. No action was taken on Allen's suggestion.

Pastor Parish-Meri Erickson: no report

Bills to be Presented:

The following bills were approved for payment by the Council.

vMix: The bill for the vMix Live Production video mixer & switcher of \$371.70 was approved for payment. Roger Rix motioned to pay this bill out of memorial funds. The motion was approved.

Heartland Heating: The council also approved payment of the Heartland Heating bill in the amount of \$622.73 as stated above under Trustees.

Administrative Report:

Pastor Rob: Pastor Rob shared that our District Superintendent, Kris Mutzenberger, visited with him about possibly being able to increase our monthly apportionment percentage. Pastor said he assured her we were doing as much as we can at this point. He also reminded us that we will be honoring our graduates on May 12. In addition, Pastor Rob will be attending the Annual Conference on June 6-8 at Bismark, and he is looking for a substitute pastor for that day as well as for June 16.

Old Business:

Fellowship Hall Speakers: The new speakers have been installed & are working. They are always automatically on, however there is the same volume button in the fellowship hall that still works to control the volume.

IRS Certified Letter Update: This situation is still being worked on per Anita.

New Business:

Request for Pauer Sound Help: The council approved a request to have Alex from Pauer Sound come out and run our sound system on Sunday, April 21 so that he can evaluate problems and make appropriate adjustments to solve streaming issues. He would charge \$50 for this, however if he finds more difficult issues he may need to increase his charges. The council agreed to this request.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:44 pm.

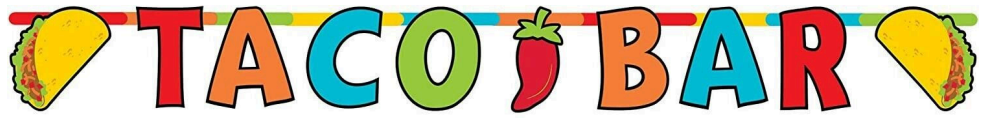
